Anvil Appoints New Director

Montréal, Canada: Anvil Mining Limited (TSX, ASX: AVM) (“Anvil”) is pleased to announce the appointment of Ambassador Kenneth L. Brown as a Non Executive Director of Anvil Mining Limited, effective immediately. Ambassador Brown has extensive experience in diplomacy, management, African politics and economics. He has been employed as the President of the Association for Diplomatic Studies and Training in Washington DC since May 2001 and has previously held a number of Foreign Services positions, mostly in Africa, for the United States of America. His former responsibilities as Senior Foreign Service Officer and U.S. Ambassador to three African countries included directing in those countries diplomatic relations, embassy management, supervision of the USAID program, and U.S. relations with organizations such as the World Bank, IMF and CARE. Ambassador Brown has a Ph.D. in Political Sociology from Cape Coast University, Ghana, an M.A. in Political Science from New York University, an M.A. in International Relations from Yale University and a B.A. in International Relations from Pomona College, in 1959.

John Sabine, Chairman of the Board of Anvil Mining Limited, stated, “We are delighted that Ambassador Brown has agreed to join Anvil’s Board of Directors. His long career in diplomacy in Africa, in particular in Central and West Africa, will be a great asset to our Company as we continue our operations and development programs in the African continent and will add considerable strength to the Board in this area”.

In addition, Mr. Gordon Chambers will be stepping down from the Board and the Company would like to thank him for his contribution over the last year. Mr. Chambers is a partner of Lawson Lundell LLP and continues as the Company’s legal advisor.

Anvil Mining Limited is an unhedged copper and silver producer whose shares are listed for trading on the Toronto Stock Exchange (as common shares) and the Australian Stock Exchange (as CDIs) under the symbol AVM. It owns and operates the Dikulushi copper-silver mine and the Kulu copper tailings operation in the Katanga Province of the DRC. In addition, the Company is currently developing the Kinsevere project, which will be the Company’s third mine development in the DRC.
